

An Embodiment of Humility and Resistance












Seyyed Ebrahim Raisi's early life was marked by significant challenges. Losing his father at the tender age of five, Ebrahim had to work hard from a young age to support his family. His childhood was spent balancing school with work, selling goods on sidewalks, and working in a poultry farm. Perhaps these experiences of orphanhood, labor and poverty, deeply ingrained in him a profound sense of justice and empathy for the deprived and oppressed.

As the President of the Islamic Republic of Iran, Dr. Ebrahim Raisi's central focus on foreign policy included the support for Palestinians and combating Islamophobia. He has been an active opponent of the occupation by the Zionist apartheid regime, working tirelessly to support local resistance movements.

## Humanitarian and Diplomatic Efforts

During the ongoing genocide of Palestinians, Raisi has consistently voiced his support for the people of Gaza. He has engaged in direct communications with different leaders all across the globe, and actively organized and participated in summits for the Palestinian cause in various international forums, urging global attention toward the continuous oppression and injustice faced by Palestinians.

Tragically, on their journey, the helicopter encountered severe weather conditions, leading to a crash that claimed the lives of Ebrahim Raisi, Iran's Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian, the Friday Imam of Tabriz, and other companions.
